### THE MARKET PLACE

The Post Office - Mr. Bolton.

Sweet Shop, Red Lion Cottage - Miss French's (Now Clydesdale).

Tucker's Stores - Mr. Boon (deliveries and to local villages).

Co-op Stores - Manager, Mr. George, (deliveries and to local villages  
with bread and milk.)

Greengrocer - Arthur Canning, (and paraffin etc.) (now Southgate.)

Haberdashery and toys, etc. - Miss Matthews (now Police Station).

Wells Store - Tailors, clothes, etc. (now part of Allan's Publishers.)

Greengrocers - Haywards, (now Viva).

Bakers - Wallins, (now Hayward & White).

### BULL RING

Second hand furniture - Mr. Slee, in Bull Ring Block.

Cobbler - Mr. Elle, (now Wirral House).

### CHAPEL SQUARE

Johnson's Timber Yard.

Doctor's Surgery in Featherton House.

Butchers - Hopcraft & Powell, later (1960's) in Pretoria House, Hudson Street.

General Store/ Grocers - Mr. Boffin, (had new shop built in Hempton Road, The  
Windmill Stores.).

### PHILCOTE STREET

*Mrs. Sykes Sweet Shop - Merrybower.*  
Callow's Coal yard, and deliveries.

### CASTLE STREET

Deely's - Haulier and Coal yard.

## SHOPS

### HIGH STREET

Goundreys Electrical Shop (accumulators) - Mr. Oldham, by Tchure.

Grocers - Mr. Lewis, next to British Legion, (now Heathfield House).

Garage - Mr. Holiday, corner of Hudson Street, (now Wish Clothing).

Saunder's Sweet Shop, corner of Hudson Street and New Street.

### NEW STREET

Butchers - Mr. Smith, (Miss Bolton worked for him), Eldred House.

Tool Repairs, saw sharpening, etc. - Mr. Stanley, in cottage down walkway by  
Eldred House.

Greengrocer also Fishmonger- Mr. Compton, (now The Three Horseshoes).

Garage, Petrol pumps, and Blacksmiths - Mr. Tibbetts, (now Dentist's Surgery).

Chemist Shop - Mr. Belton, later Mr. Shaw (now Coniston House).

Ironmongers - Mr. Beardsley, (now Huntleys).

Grocery Shop - Miss Fowler, next to The Three Tuns, (now Regency).

Bakers - Mr. Course, next to The Stile, (now The Old Bakery).

Mrs. Hoare at The Old Farmhouse in lower New Street had a village milk round with push cart.

## BANK

Barclays came on Fridays to Wells Store in Market Square.

DEDDINGTON - Late 1950's

PUBS

Kings Arms, Horse Fair - Stanley Hall. (Petrol Pumps next door.)

Red Lion, Market Place.

Unicorn Hotel, Market Place. - Billingtons.

Holcombe Hotel, plus ice cream shop, High Street, - Mr. West, then Johnny Byles.

British Legion Club, High Street.

The Volunteer, New Street. (Now Russell House.)

The Crown and Tuns, New Street - Mr. Callow.

DEDDINGTON 1960's.

## SHOPS

Vet in Chapel Square – late 1960's after it had been Grocer's shop.

Silversmith - Mr. Hawksley, in part of Quinque House, New Street.

Cromwell Café, in Eldred House, New Street.

Solicitors - Fortescue's, West end of Whichway, The Bullring.

Banks - Midland Bank came to Fortescue's, Barclays to 'Ticky Wells' shop (now part of Philip Allan's, Market Place,) on Fridays only, also ?Bull Ring, 1970's in what is now Steve Miller's, Hairdresser.

Silversmith - Mr. & Mrs. Ackland , Silver jewellery, etc., Coniston House, New Street, 1960/70's.

Bakers - Wallins, north of The Tchure, Market Place, (now Hayward & White) closed in December 1988.

The building at the base of Goose Green was once a Mortuary.
