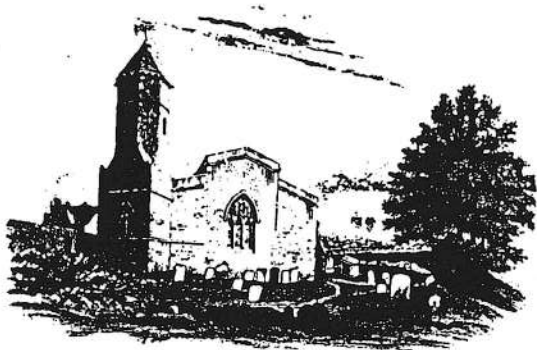

Deddington parish in the County of Oxon' [304]

We (whose names are hereunder written) Inhabitants of the Parishes of Deddington aforesaid have in the Presence of Almighty God promised, vowed & protested and by these presents doe promise vow and protest to maintain & defend as far as lawfully we may with our lives power and estates the true reformed Protestant Religion expressed in the doctrine of the Church of England against all Popery and Popish innovations within this Realm contrary to the same doctrine and according to the duty of our allegiance His Ma'ties Royall Person Honour and Estate; As also the Power and Privileges of Parliament; The lawfull Right and Liberties of the Subject and every person that maketh this Protestation in whatsoever he shall doe in the lawfull pursuance of the same. And to our Power and as far as lawfully we may we will oppose & by all waies & means indeavour to bring to condigne punishment all such as shall either by Force, Practise, Counsells, Plots, Conspiracies or otherwise, doe anything to the contrary of any thing in this Protestation contained etc.

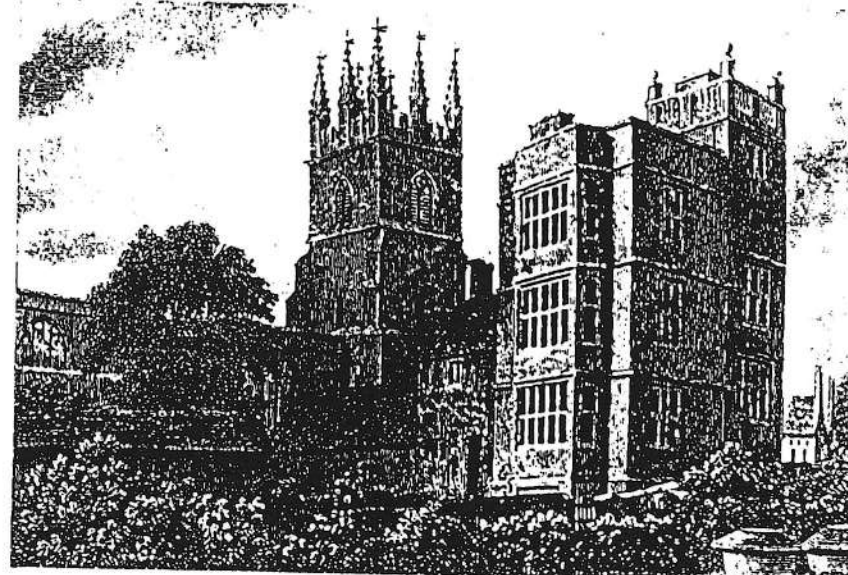
