

ANN AND JOHN CHURCHILL, of Woodstock, Oxfordshire, England, arrived in Australia, probably in 1844. Went first to Maitland, and then to Lake Innes, Port Macquarie. It is thought that they are buried at "The Park", Telegraph Point.

Their children were, as follows:-

Fall from a tree & died.

The old Churchill home is at Woodstock and on the roof the names of the Churchill people were carved in the leadwork on the roof. Some of them go as far back as 1759.
