

## THE STILE HOUSE –1893 CONVEYANCE INDENTURE

**This** Indenture made the twenty fourth day of March One thousand eight hundred and ninety three **Between Frederick Gulliver** of Deddington in the County of Oxford Gentleman of the one part and **Richard Page Bull** also of Deddington aforesaid Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of the other part: **Witnesseth** that in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and Twenty Five pounds to the said Frederick Gulliver this day paid by the said Richard page Bull for the purchase of the fee simple of the hereditaments hereby granted and conveyed or intended so to be of which sum the said Frederick Gulliver hereby acknowledges the receipt the said Frederick Gulliver as **Beneficial Owner** hereby conveys unto the said Richard page Bull and his heirs **all that** messuage or tenement with the kitchen formerly used as a Bakehouse with store room over stabling coachhouses large barn and other buildings.. orchard yard garden and premises situate and being on the East side of the New Street in Deddington in the County of Oxford formerly in the occupation of Benjamin pritchett afterwards of George Chater and now of the said Frederick Gulliver and Richard page Bull **and also All Those** two cottages or Tenements with the outbuildings and yard thereto adjoining and belonging also situate and being on the East side of the New Street in Deddington aforesaid and adjoining to the said last mentioned messuage or tenement and yard on the South and West sides thereof formerly in the several occupations of Thomas Green and William Gibbs late of William Kilby and George Lewis and now unoccupied **To hold** the several hereditaments and premises unto and to the use of the said Richard page Bull his heirs and assigns in fee simple.. **In Witness** whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first before written.
