The Lord Lieutenant makes a short speech and hands the "Arms" to the Chairman of the Council, who will respond.
11.45am	The Chairman invites the Bishop of Dorchester to Bless and Dedicate the "Arms"
11.50am	Photocall to record the event
12 noon	Chairman thanks the Lord Lieutenant and the Bishop and invites the Ceremonial Party to proceed the Town Hall
6	Trumpet Fanfare as the ceremonial party leaves the platform Bells to ring
	Organ will play Crown Imperial by William Walton The Ceremonial Party will be followed by the Special Guests and then the rest of those present
12 noon	Guard of Honour outside the Church as the Ceremonial Party emerge and walk to the Town Hall
12.15pm	Trumpet Fanfare Chairman invites the Lord Lieutenant to unveil the Coat of Arms on the south wall of the Town Hall
12.20pm	Chairman invites the Lord Lieutenant to declare the "Pudd'n'Pie Fair" open.
