There are over 600 people named in this book, many of whom came from a relatively small number of families during WWI and WWII: for example, there are 17 different Callows and the same number of Sykes, while other families, such as Garrett, Cowley, Davis, Hawkins and Smith all have multiple (but slightly fewer) entries. So it is all too easy to make incorrect assumptions as to which names and initials relate to which person. The lists at the start of each chapter therefore contain only the surnames of those who served contained in that particular chapter.
