27 April 1878 Cricket match between Mr. Wells's Bible Class and Band of Hope

25 September 1879 Deddington Volunteer Rifle Fête in Castle Grounds. Cricket match, tug of war. After tea, short dramatic and musical entertainment in the pavilion. Dancing till eleven o'clock.

15 July 1880 Two day celebration of Independent Sunday School centenary. Also children from Hempton, Clifton and Great Barford. 470 scholars processed through streets to field behind The Grove lent by Mr. J. Clarke for a Nonconformist service, with c.500 friends and family. On Monday, cricket match in Castle Grounds. Then 393 children and teachers processed to Hempton Way, and were conveyed to Tomhill Farm for tea and games. Over 800 people at Tomhill.

23 September 1880 Cricket match at Castle Grounds between Deddington United Cricket Club and Mr. T.H. Wells' eleven.

Programme of songs subjoined.
