HE Viscount Don Thomas da Silva Telles, late Ambassadour from the King to the Court of Madrid, has had since his Return divers Conferences with his Majelty's Ministers, which are

The 20th Inst. the King issued Orders for all Colonels and other Officers in this Capital, to repair to their Regiments in ten Days; fo that the intended
