HEMPTON At the time of writing there are no pubs or restaurants in Hempton. In the late 18th century there were two inns, but by 1821 only the Plough remained. It stood at the crossroads until the early 20th century, when it was closed and later demolished.

EDDINGTON was possibly founded in the 9th or 10th century by a Mercian lord called Daeda. The settlement came to be known as Daedintun - 'the village of Daeda's people Over the centuries, eating and drinking places in great variety have come and gone. Today Deddington, with Clifton and Hempton, is a thriving community with some very pleasant pubs and restaurants, every one of them good of its kind. We list them in alphabetical order. Blacksmith's Forge Market Place Deddington


