

References to Deddington's post office in newspapers

The following entries, all bar one, are from [*Jackson's Oxford Journal*](#). These indicate that there was a post office in Deddington as early as 1803, when the **postmaster was Mr. East.**

21 May 1803, page 2

WANTED, in a Gentleman's Family, - An active fteady YOUNG WOMAN, as *Houfe-Maid*; capable of getting up fine Linen, and Working at her Needle. An unexceptionable Character will be required from her laft Place.

The Daily Advertiser, Oracle, and True Briton, 4 November 1807, page 1

TO GROCERS.

A YOUTH, aged 15, of a respectable family in the country, and of a diligent, attentive, and good disposition, wishes for a SITUATION in the Grocery Line, in a house of full trade, within the Liberties of the City, wherein he might board, lodge, and be considered in every respect as one of the family. A small premium will be given.

21 March 1812, page 3

A Young Lady of respectability wishes to engage as FRENCH and ENGLISH TEACHER, in a School, or Family, where there are two or three young ladies under 10 years of age: She can give unexceptionable reference.

Letters addressed, post paid, to A.B. at the Deddington post office, will be immediately attended to.
