Thank you for your letter of 13th March regarding the proposed use by the Deddington Society of the tennis court at the above named school.

I understand that there is only one court available and the charge for this would normally be 30p per hour. As there is no net provided, I feel that a reduction of 5p per hour on the above charge would be reasonable.

So far as the re-surfacing of this area is concerned, I do not think that the Education Committee would be prepared to meet the cost of this work in view of the limited life of the school as an educational establishment.

If you wish to use the court in the coming season, you should make application in the normal way, giving details of the dates when you would require the court. I would stress that payment must accompany your application which will not otherwise be considered.
