I doe give unto him that preache twentie shillings. Item all the rest of my good, not givyn
before, I doe give and bequeath unto my Brother Iohn Hale Minister of Godd word whom
I doo, confesse and appoynt to bee the Executor of this my last will and Testament, And if it
happen so, that my said Executor by reason of the present troublous, rameth tooþ, present at my
buriall Then, my will is, And I doe give full power and authoritie unto, my two friends Mr.
John Moyatt and Thomas Lane to disburse out of my good, what they consider to bee, needfull
for my burry all. And also to receyve and deliver what they shall haue to bee, needfull and
convenient accordinge to the true intent of this my last will and Testament until such time
