

Memorandum the said hundredth forty and fower of Benjamin Seaward of the County of York being sick of
 body but of good and perfect memory do make and declare this my last will and Testament in
 manner and form following: I give and bequeath my soul into the hand of God, and my body to
 Christian buryall. Item that portion of good which God hath given me, I doe give and bequeath in
 manner and forme following: I doe give unto my niesen Elizabeth Gale femme of Doctor Gale
 deceased the sume of five poundes. Item I doe give unto my wifes Milliam Gale some of the said
 Doctor Gale deceased the sume of fower poundes. Item I doe give unto my wifes Katherine Gale
 daughter of the said Doctor Gale two galle Ringes and two little braceletts of Gold, one a paire of
 braceletts of Corall and likewise more I give to the said Katherine five Dracmes Lethwaite and five
 yards of Stamyn stuffe wiche she hath prepared for it of gold and silke for a Lethwaite. More I give
 to the said Katherine one straited Carpet and sixe Dracmes of the same. Item I give unto my wifes
 Anne Gale my second best Gold Ringe. Item I give unto my wifes Samuel Mayne some shillinges
 Kipper. Item I give to my Goddaughter Susanna Lawrtt my Myrrour, mylme, Gowns and some
 shillinges of money. Item I give to my Goddaughter Sarah, wyfe of some shillinges. Item I give to
 my Goddaughter Mary Seaward some shillinges. Item I give to my Goddaughter Agnes Gale
 some shillinges. Item I give to my Goddaughter Mary Turner some shillinges. Item I give to my
 Godsonne John Cox some shillinges. Item I give to the Widow Lawrtt of Wynt one Lincoln and
 Lethwaite and one Dracme smock. Item I give to my servant Mrs Darnitt fower Lethwaite
 sixe, one blewe, one yellowe, one willow ruller and one lincoln woollie. More I give my said servant
 three night waistrates of lincoln and one waistrate of East holland and one Dracme smock. More
 I give my said servant the sume of some shillinges. Item I give my said servant all my
 butter and cheese and all my Earthen Pott, and all my tennings spoone. Item I give to Joane
 Dafflane one Dracme Lincoln. Item I give to my wifes Katherine Gale before named all my
 wearings apparrell of Woollen, Excepting such thinges as I have given before. Item my desire
 is, That Mr Cadden of the same or other waite Mr Dabbar doe preach at my funerals. And
 I doe give unto him that preached trentis shillinges. Item all the rest of my good, not given
 before, I doe give and bequeath unto my Brother Josias Gale Minister of Gods word, whom
 I doe constitute and appoint to bee the Executor of this my last will and Testament, And if it
 happen soe, that my said Executor by reason of the present troubles, cannot bee present at my
 buryall, then my will is, And I doe give full power and authoritie unto my two friends
 John Maygatt and Thomas Lane to distribute out of my good, what they shal see to bee needfull
 for my buryall, And also to receive and deliver what they shal see to bee needfull and
 convenient according to the true intent of this my last will and Testament withall such thinges
 as my said Executor shall come himselfe, Susanna Seaward, Agnes Seaward and Dilibered, in
 the presence of us John Maygatt, Daniel Ffellow, Thomas Lane.
