

ORDER FOR RELEASE FROM NAVAL SERVICE (CLASS A)

- You are being released from Service, by order made under authority of the Naval and Marine Forces (Temporary Release from Service) Act, 1940, as a Class A Release. (See Note 2.)
- The date of your Release will be 8 MAY 1946 194... *SCV 2 in 26 NOV 1947*

* Delete this line if no foreign service leave has been granted.

- You have been granted leave as follows, starting on the day after the date of this Order :—
* 6 days' S.O. foreign service leave expiring on 13 MARCH 1946 and 56 days' resettlement leave expiring on the date of your Release.

- You are free to take up civil employment at any time after the date of this Order.
- You may wear civilian clothing while on leave, and you are to cease to wear uniform after the date of your release.
- After your release you will be regarded as being in Reserve and you will be liable until the end of the present emergency to recall to the Naval Service by revocation of this Order at any time. You will not be recalled, however, except in extreme emergency. (See Note 3.)

You are to report all changes to the Commodore of your Depot (if a Royal Naval Reservist to the Registrar General, Shipping and Seamen, Llantrisant Road, Llandaff, Cardiff; if a Royal Marine to the Commandant of your Division). **While you are on leave** you should **also** report any changes of address to the Officer in Charge of the Pay Office from which you were paid.

- Your Service Certificate will be sent to you after your Release.
- You should carry this Order with you until your Service Certificate is received and you are to produce it when required.

NOTES.

- NOTE 1.—This date is the date on which the rating leaves his ship or establishment.
- NOTE 2.—Class A consists of individuals released from the Forces under the Plan for Re-allocation of Man-power during the interim period between the defeat of Germany and the defeat of Japan, in priority of age and length of war service.
- NOTE 3.—This release does not affect the normal liability of Pensioners to further service nor of Reservists (who are so liable under the Naval Forces (Extension of Service) Act, 1944) to further service or training.
