## **Ken Garrett, 1924-91**

The funeral of Kenneth Garrett, 67 of Hempton, took place on 17 April 1991.



Ken was born into a farming family in Clifton. He was first employed in the Great Western Railway Telegraph office in Banbury and developed a keen interest in railways and steam engines. In the last war he served in the RAF and performed duty in Egypt, Syria, Iraq and France. He married Edith in 1947 and came to live in Castle Street, Deddington. They had two sons, Peter and Andrew.

After the war Ken worked as a signalman at Aynho railway junction and in 1961 took over a newsagent business, first operating from

Castle Street. In 1965 he became postmaster in Deddington, combining the Post Office with the news agency. He retired in 1985. Ken was a Parish Councillor for many years and was twice Chairman of the Council. He was also a governor of Deddington C of E Primary School and a trustee of two local charities. He was very popular and much loved for his many acts of service.
