DEDDINGTON, Aug. 30.—The return match between the Deddington and Brackley Cricket Clubs, was played here this day. Deddington went in first, and although under the discouragement of J. Churchill being caught out the first ball, from a ball by Peter Hopercraft, the Deddington men scored 106 runs. Brackley then went in, and got 25 only.
