Mr. Hawkes' farm premises here, early in the year, a meritorious endeavour was made to form and equip a brigade, and to parchase a new fire engine, the existing engine being worn out and almost useless. At the instance of the brigade the following letter was addressed to some of the principal landowners in the district: Deddington, May, 1883. Sir, -A volunteer fire brigade is being formed in Deddington, and the committee venture to appeal to you, as an owner of property in the district, for a donation you, as an owner of property in the district, for a donation towards providing a new engine and apparatus and the necessary equipments for the brigade, for which £100 is required. Deddington is the centre of a large number of villages, and the need for an efficient engine and brigade has long been felt. The Insurance Companies doing the principal business in the district have subscribed, although they consider the matter to be one entirely for the owners of property, it being always borne in mind that uninsured as well as insured property is at stake. After the first cost of establishment has been defrayed, the brigade, engine and hose will be maintained by a small rate, which the Watching and Lighting Committee have power to raise. Steeple Barton, a week ago, the want of an engine was seriously felt. Fortunately the Deddington brigade had been well drilled, and rendered good service in assisting the

Woodstock brigade, and in working the Steede Aston engine. We venture to hope that many people interested in property is this neighbourhood, under whose notice the laudable effort to obtain an engine at this convenient centre has not been brought, may now be induced to volunteer
