CHAPEL OF ST JAMES (former), by *J. C. Buckler & Son*, 1851-3. Of Aynho stone. Chancel and nave in one, with buttressed double w bellcote, s porch and NE vestry. Lancet windows, with a stepped triplet, E. Now offices, with a large dormer over the chancel.

To the E, a farmhouse and pub, both C17-C18 and thatched. - Opposite, Chapel Close leads s to the former WESLEYAN CHAPEL, rebuilt 1869. Lancet style, red brick with yellow trim, the front stuccoed.

MANOR FARM, a little SW of St James Chapel, is of two builds, the W half dated 1685, the E with a projecting two-storey gabled porch (now central). Both parts have three-light mullioned windows.

CLIFTON MILL forms a good group by the River Cherwell, $\frac{1}{8}$ m. ENE. C17 mill along the road, extended W in the C19; long mill house at right angles. One breast-shot wheel survives.
