Notices by the Banbury, Brailes and Shipston Turnpike Trust, of which Samuel Churchill, junior was joint Clerk, have not been transcribed.

(2) The overwhelming majority of notices and advertisements were repeated, sometimes many times. Notices by Turnpike Trusts would typically be repeated several or more times. Repeat notices and advertisements have not been recorded.

(3) Jackson's Oxford Journal had a tendency to refer to Clifton Hampden, between Abingdon and Dorchester-on-Thames, as Clifton, giving rise to the potential for confusion with Clifton in the parish of Deddington. Relevant newspaper entries have been interpreted in accordance with the context where possible.
